Legal basis for protection against refugees

- Declaration of Human Rights adopted by the UN General Assembly in
 1948 → ensure that every human being has the same rights
- European Union: 1999 Amsterdam Treaty empowered the Council to take actions against discrimination on grounds of race, sex, ethnic origin, religion/belif, disability, age or sexual orientation (§13 Amsterdam Treaty)
- On the basis of Amsterdam treaty four guidelines were passed: European Racial Equality Directive (2000), Framework Directive on Employment (2000), Gender Directive Civil Law (2004) and Gender Guidelines Employment Law (2002)

General act on equal treatment

- General Act on equal treatment implements these four directives in German law, is passed in 2006
- Objective is to prevent and eliminate discrimination in terms of civil law, access to workplace, goods and services
- Discrimination is defined as:
 - Direct Discrimination
 - Indirect Discrimination
 - > Harassment
 - > Sexual harassment

But: justified difference of treatment are noted as well

Dimensions of discrimination

Discrimination is prohibited in Germany on seven grounds:

- Race/Ethnic Origion
- > Sex
- Religion/Belief/worldview
- Disability and chronic diseases
- > Age
- Sexual Orientation
- (Multiple Discrimination)

Where can discrimination against refugees occur?

- Applying for a job and taking up employment
- i.g. muslim women wearing headscarves
- In public offices and authorities
- i.g. racial profiling
- Access to services
- i.g. opening a bank account
- Searching for houses

project targets and actions

- General equal Treatment works irrespective of a person's resident permit
- → Civil society organizations have to know about legal discrimination protection (General act on equal treatment)
- → Civil society organizations have to support refugees in finding advice in cases of discrimination (e.g. Federal Anti-Discrimination Agency and local networks)
- → Professional Networking of organizations
- → Strengthen knowledge about empowerment for refugees

project targets and actions

- Rights not charity as a basis for social work
- Do not neglec discrimination
- Talk about discrimination
- → Protection against Discrimination is a step towards participation in society
